Chemeketa Community College

The College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP) is a federally funded program designed to support students from migrant and seasonal farmworker backgrounds during their first year in college. The program provides students with both financial assistance and support services, with the goal of preparing them to continue their education at a four-year college or university.

Program Services

CAMP provides the following services:

- Tuition assistance
- Transportation assistance
- CAMP courses
- Tutoring/Mentoring
- Academic advising
- Personal counseling
- Career counseling
- Book assistance
- Health resources
- Monthly stipend
- University visits

To Qualify

Applicant must meet the following criteria:

- The applicant or his/her parent(s) or legal guardian(s) must have worked at least 75 days within the last two years as a migrant or seasonal farmworker. This includes any activity directly related to the production of crops, dairy products, poultry or livestock; the cultivation or harvesting of trees including nursery and forestry work; or fish farm work.

or

Currently participating or have participated in a Migrant Education Program (MEP) during any of your school grade levels (K-12).

or

Currently participating or have participated in a National Farmworker Jobs Program (NFJP) of Section 167 of the WIA.

- Have a high school diploma or GED certificate.
- Plan to attend Chemeketa Community College full-time (at least 12 credit hours per term.)
- Demonstrate financial need according to federal income guidelines.
- Be eligible to apply for federal financial aid (FAFSA.)
- Be in the first year of college undergraduate studies.

To Apply

Submit **all** of the following:

1. A completed **CAMP Application** form.
2. A **personal statement** (written in English, 1-2 pages, double-space typed).
3. Two (2) **CAMP recommendation forms** completed by people (no family members) who know you, your work, and your goals. You might ask a teacher, a counselor, or an employer. Please use the enclosed forms.
4. A copy of your **high school or GED transcript**. If not completed, you will be required to submit a copy of an unofficial transcript. Upon graduation, an official transcript must be submitted.
5. A copy of your college **Placement Test scores**. All applicants are required to take this test as part of the CAMP application. Call 503-399-6556 to schedule an appointment to take the test.
6. **Proof of eligibility**, you must submit **one** of the following:
 - *Migrant or seasonal farmworker*: You will have to present proof of qualified farmwork such as W-2 forms or check stubs.
 - or*
 - *Migrant Education Program (MEP)*: If you participate(d) in one of these programs in school (K-12), you will need to provide us with a current certificate of eligibility (COE).
 - or*
 - *National Farmworker Jobs Program (NFJP) of Section 167 of the WIA*: If you participate(d) in one of these programs, you will be required to provide valid proof of participation.

In addition, you have to make sure that the Eligibility Verification Section in your CAMP application form is completely filled out.

Only complete application packets will be called in for an interview.

El Programa Universitario de Apoyo para Emigrantes (CAMP) es un programa creado con fondos federales que fue diseñado para apoyar a estudiantes con historiales de trabajo agrícola migratorio o temporal en sus familias durante su primer año de estudios universitarios. El programa ofrece apoyo económico y servicios académicos para los estudiantes, con el firme propósito de prepararlos para que eventualmente continúen sus carreras universitarias en una institución de estudios superiores de cuatro años.

Para Calificar

El solicitante deberá reunir los siguientes requisitos:

- El solicitante o uno de sus padres/tutores legales tiene que haber trabajado por lo menos 75 días en los últimos 2 años como trabajador agrícola migratorio o temporal. Esto incluye cualquier actividad directamente relacionada con la producción de cosechas, alimentos lácteos, la avicultura o la ganadería; el cultivo y cosecha de árboles incluyendo trabajos en viveros y la selvicultura; o trabajos en granjas pesqueras.

Participar actualmente o haber participado en un Programa Educativo para Emigrantes (MEP) durante cualquier grado escolar (K-12).

ó

Participar actualmente o haber participado en un Programa Nacional de Trabajos Agrícolas (NFJP) de acuerdo con la Sección 167 del WIA.

- Tener certificado de preparatoria o su equivalente (GED).
- Planear tomar clases de tiempo completo en Chemeketa (por lo menos 12 créditos por trimestre).
- Demostrar necesidad económica de acuerdo con los lineamientos federales sobre ingresos.
- Ser elegible para solicitar ayuda económica federal (FAFSA).
- Estar en el primer año de estudios universitarios.

Para Solicitar la Beca

El interesado deberá entregar **todo** lo siguiente:

1. Una **solicitud de CAMP** completada.
2. Una **narración personal** (escrita en inglés, 1-2 páginas, teclada a doble espacio).
3. Dos (2) **formatos CAMP de recomendación** completados por personas (que no sean familiares) que te conozcan bien, tu trabajo, y tus metas. Puedes solicitárselas a un maestro, un consejero o un empleador. Favor de usar los formatos anexos.
4. Una copia de la **boleta de calificaciones** de la preparatoria o su equivalente (GED). Si aún no has concluido tus estudios de preparatoria, deberás presentar una copia de la boleta no oficial y una copia del documento oficial al graduarte.
5. Una copia de los **resultados del examen diagnóstico** aplicado por el colegio. Todos los solicitantes son requeridos que tomen este examen como parte de la solicitud de CAMP. Llama al 503-399-6556 para hacer tu cita para el examen.
6. **Prueba de elegibilidad**, entregar **uno** de los siguientes:
 - *Trabajador agrícola migratorio o temporal*: Presentar prueba de trabajo agrícola calificado como los formatos W-2 o talones de cheque.
 - ó
 - *Programa Educativo para Emigrantes (MEP)*: Si participas o participaste en uno de estos programas en la escuela (K-12), tendrás que traernos un certificado de elegibilidad actual (COE).
 - ó
 - *Programa Nacional de Trabajos Agrícolas (NFJP) de acuerdo con la Sección 167 del WIA*: Si participas o participaste en uno de estos programas, deberás presentar prueba válida de participación en dicho programa.

Además, asegúrate que la Sección de Verificación de Elegibilidad en tu solicitud de CAMP sea llenada completamente.

Solo solicitudes completas serán llamadas para entrevista.
