"Because I became a mom at such a young age, no one had any other expectation for me, other than to drop out of school and work paycheck to paycheck. I never thought of it that way. I felt like the odd one out. I always dreamed of going to college and looking further into my future. While I had a setback or two, it's never too late to start something you have always dreamt of, as long as you're determined."

Education is a catalyst for change, and there's no denying that without it, your options are limited. The grit, drive, and intrinsic motivation in our students never ceases to inspire. I suspect you feel the same way and share the commitment that we must continue creating opportunities like this in our community.

Students at Chemeketa are getting a world-class college experience. The best in Oregon, according to recent recognition from EDsmart, a national publisher of college resources and rankings. Working with the foundation staff, board, and the support of our donors, we were able to provide roughly \$760,000 in scholarship, assistance, and program support in 2020-2021. That includes awarding 355 students with more than \$480,000 in scholarships. Together, we make college possible. Together, we change lives.

GRETCHEN S. SCHUETTE STRENGTH IN DIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP

In the interest of supporting Chemeketa values of diversity and college access, this scholarship was established by the Midland Area Community Foundation and the Rollin M. Gerstacker Foundation with extensive funding and leadership from former Chemeketa President Gretchen Schuette. To date, this scholarship has helped more than 180 students pursue their dreams.

"I come from an impoverished multi-racial family of six. During my elementary school years, my family faced homelessness. While navigating the pandemic in the summer of 2020, my family lost everything we owned in the Beachy Creek Fire. Once again, we found ourselves homeless with no household goods, no keepsakes or personal things, and very few resources. This had a huge impact on our family. Though these are hard times and we are facing huge obstacles, I have not stopped my pursuit of a quality education in order to attain my career and life goals. Though we are still struggling to find a new home, my siblings and I are continuing our education at Chemeketa. I know that with this support from you and others, my family will surely persevere.

I am currently working toward an Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer degree and plan to transfer to a four-year university. My focus is on criminal justice and mathematics. With these skills, I plan to pursue a career in forensic science. Being an individual experiencing significant poverty, this scholarship and other support I've received are enabling me to achieve a higher education and better myself and my family. So, I truly and deeply thank you for granting me this scholarship opportunity. I will use this resource that was given so generously to its fullest in furthering my education."


NATE TURNER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

"My Great Grandma always told me to go to school and get a degree so I wouldn't have to work as hard as they did. Immigrating from Portugal, they always wanted me to have more opportunities than they had. It's an incredible feeling to not only be the first person in my family to go to college, but to graduate with a degree. When I first began taking college-level classes in high school, I wasn't quite sure what I wanted to do. I was young, and all I cared about was making a lot of money. As I continued exploring options, I realized that more than anything, I wanted to be happy. I've always loved helping people, and the more I searched, I felt called to be an Emergency Responder.

Your scholarship is helping make that possible and will make a world of difference in my continuing education. This is my second year at Chemeketa, and I wasn't sure how I was going to afford the paramedic program this year. This scholarship in Nate's memory is allowing me to achieve that dream. Once I graduate this year, I will be starting my career in the fire service. On behalf of myself and my fiance, I want to thank you again for the Nate Turner Memorial Scholarship. 


## DOLLARS AND CENTS





It made sense to start a faculty-led scholarship program for our students, as a way of encouraging continued education in this important area of study but also as a way to let others in the Chemeketa community see what we see every day in our students. The psychology faculty are inspired and impressed by the goals, work ethic, compassion and commitment so often seen, felt and heard in our student ranks."

I never imagined myself being able to do anything, even something as simple as learning English. Still, I had always wanted to be part of the science field. I've always had questions that science never failed to give me the answers to. Now, I am in my second and final year at Chemeketa and will be graduating in June. I will continue my education at Western Oregon University where I will major in microbiology.

To be chosen out of all the amazing candidates is a blessing. I know Carol previously lived in the Philippines, which is pretty awesome to feel that connection. If it wasn't for the support from Paul and Carol, I would have ended up in the streets last year. It was a really tough year for me in terms of housing, and I'm just so grateful that you read my story, that you chose to help me, and that you gave me another reason to continue my education. Growing up as an orphan is not easy, and by awarding me this scholarship, somehow you made me feel fostered. From the bottom of my heart, thank you so much Paul and Carol Manka."


