A LETTER FROM THE FOUNDATION PRESIDENT

Dear Friends,

I am pleased to continue serving as the President of the Chemeketa Community College Foundation Board of Directors. As a CFP® Professional, I’m drawn to numbers. Chemeketa’s numbers tell a compelling story:

- 53 years of changing students’ lives
- 7 locations across 4 counties
- 90+ CTE certificates and degrees in ~ 50 occupational areas
- 42 transfer course disciplines
- 32 collaborations with local high schools
- 3 partnerships with area state prisons/facilities

While we see about 17,500 students formally enrolled at Chemeketa, it’s pretty clear the impact goes much further. Chemeketa creates \$895 million in added income for our community each year. This is impressive, particularly in the years immediately following a global pandemic.

While all organizations had to adapt in 2020, Chemeketa Community College continues to evolve, improving existing programs and creating new ones when needed. A few of the 2022-2023 developments include reopening the Commercial

Truck Driving training program, and completing design and development of the first Bachelor of Applied Science degree to be offered by a community college in Oregon (beginning Fall 2023).

Chemeketa is also collaborating with other universities to do what is best for students. Whether partnering with OIT on Community Health Projects or collaborating with WOU to create a streamlined and affordable pathway to a bachelor’s degree, Chemeketa continues to innovate. You can find more information about these and other developments within this report.

Chemeketa is resilient because students are resilient. The Foundation Board hears from these students at every meeting; it grounds us in purpose. Working with the foundation staff, board, and our donors’ support, we provided more than 350 students with over \$540,000 in scholarships in 2022. Together, we make college possible. This scholarship was established to support students in Yamhill Valley who are pursuing a career in Fire Protection or Nursing Programs and plan to join a local entity after graduation to benefit healthcare needs within Yamhill County.

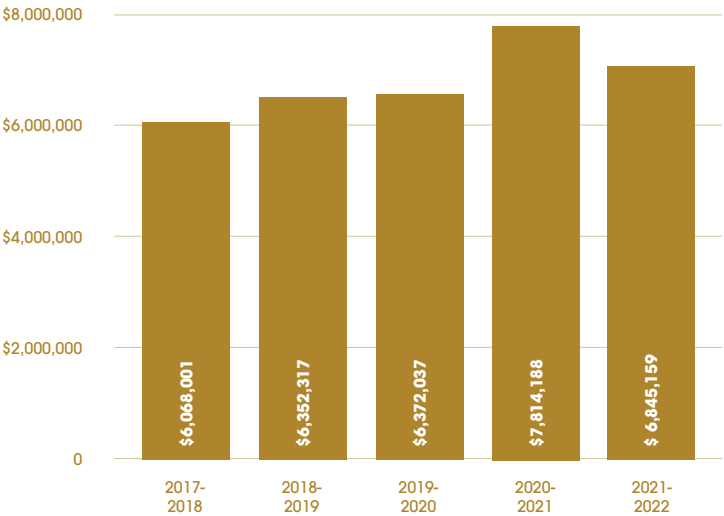

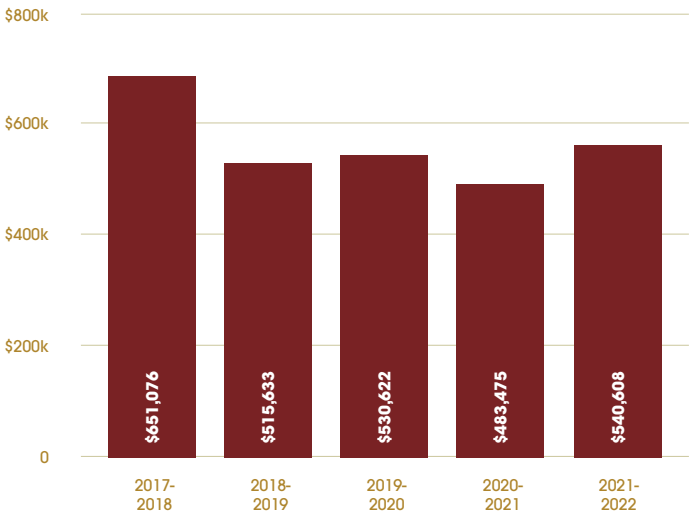

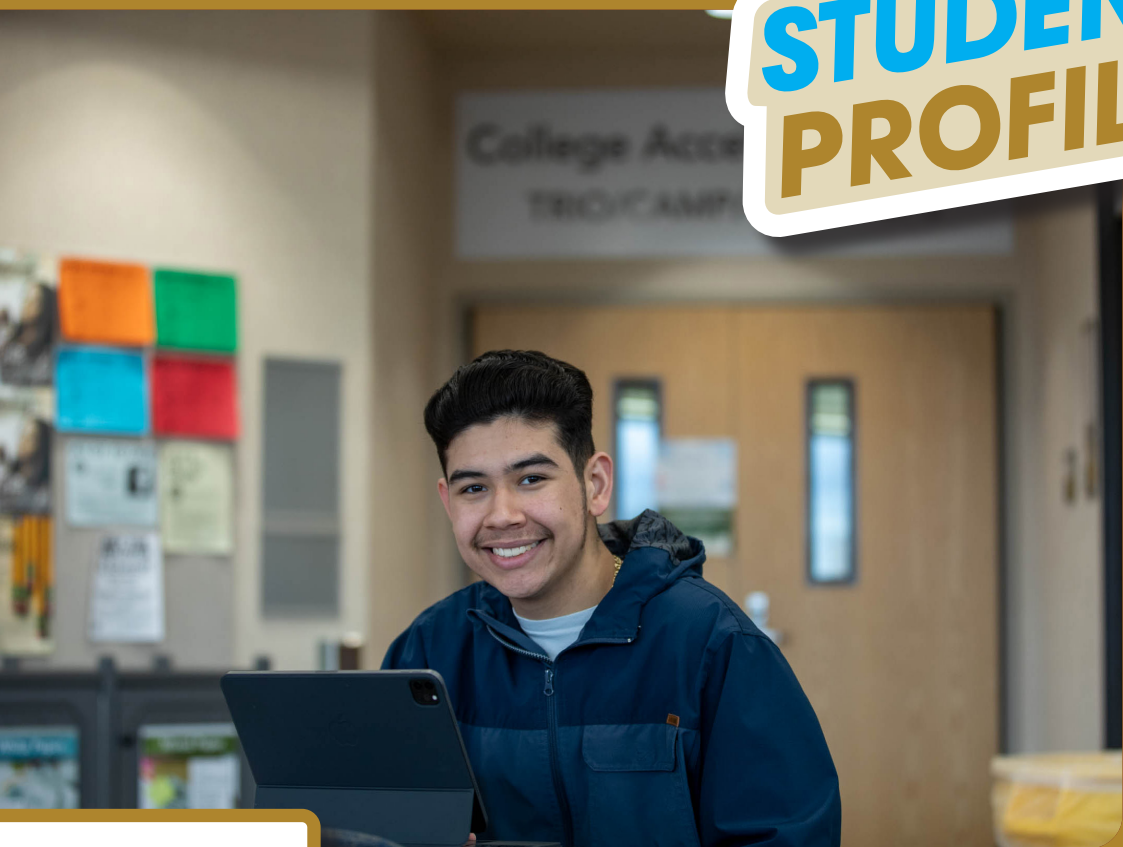

TRANSFER AGREEMENT SIGNED WITH WOU

Chemeketa Community College and Western Oregon University initiated a new partnership agreement that will provide students completing a transfer degree at Chemeketa with a seamless transition to WOU. The agreement was signed at a special ceremony at the WOU campus in February 2022 by presidents Jessica Howard (Chemeketa) and Jay Kenton (WOU).

This new program, named "Direct Connect," will guarantee WOU admission to qualifying Chemeketa graduates who satisfy WOU's transfer admission requirements. Students on this pathway will receive specialized advising and support throughout their educational experience at both institutions, which will provide a clear pathway to completing a bachelor's degree in the equivalent of four years of full-time attendance: two years at Chemeketa and two years at WOU. Students in designated transfer programs will receive junior status at WOU and credit for completing all lower-division general education requirements. Direct Connect will make the attainment of a bachelor's degree accessible to more students on account of lower tuition costs at the community college for the first two years of instruction.

CHEMEKETA - WESTERN OREGON TRANSFER DEGREE SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT

Former Chemeketa President Gretchen Schuette established this scholarship in memory of her parents, Carl and Esther Gerstacker. This scholarship encourages students to continue and complete a baccalaureate degree at WOU. WOU offers a partner scholarship upon the student's successful transfer.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

In 2022, Chemeketa implemented a Guided Pathways Model for programs, which provides students clear direction and support. Pathways are groups of related academic and career/technical programs and disciplines, and each pathway includes several tracks that lead to degrees, certificates, and/or transfer opportunities for students to reach their goals.

Each year, in partnership with the Oregon Tech Dental Hygiene Program, our Foundation supports student initiatives and service projects to improve dental health in our community. These service projects are aimed at educating and treating vulnerable populations in our community, free of charge, through the Dental Clinic on Chemeketa's Salem Campus. Each year, OIT's second year Dental Hygiene cohort is split into groups and are given the opportunity to build a community health project and goal around a population of their choice. During this year-long course, students identify a target population, build a profile and needs assessment to determine what they should include in their project to best serve the population, create a full-scale grant proposal identifying the costs and outcomes of their community health project, and present these projects to the Chemeketa Foundation and OIT Advisory Board. This year, the projects included free dental care for elderly residents in low-income housing, education and demonstrations for 2nd graders at a local elementary school, family support for teen parents, and education and treatment for women currently residing at Simonka Place and Grace House. Students gather supplies and in-kind contributions from local and national organizations, and



remaining costs are presented to our Foundation for support. Approved projects are implemented during spring term when each cohort provides preventative care education, demonstrations, dental screenings and assessments, and in-clinic care including X-rays, cleaning, and restoration services free of charge. We are proud to partner with OIT on these vital projects that keep our community smiling.

DENTAL CLINIC FUND

The Dental Clinic at Chemeketa was built to meet the need for trained dental health professionals in our community and provides low-cost or no-fee preventive dental services to families in Chemeketa's service district which includes Marion, Polk, and Yamhill counties. The clinic offers preventative care, outreach client education, bilingual services in Spanish, and convenient clinic hours, to provide services for the underserved and underinsured. Twenty eight dental stations include patient chairs with vacuums, compressors, lighting, and other equipment used in patient exams. Chemeketa's Dental Assisting and OIT's Dental Hygiene students are able to offer approximately 3,600+ appointments annually.

"We decided to start the BIT Scholarship Fund because students were struggling to afford their education while putting themselves through school. As a Chemeketa grad myself, I and many others in my cohort struggled with this. We now have an opportunity to give back both financially and through mentoring the next generation.

Students who can focus on their education without the financial challenge of making ends meet, remain focused on their education which in turn makes them better code professionals. This results in buildings that are safe, energy efficient, ADA accessible, and better suited to withstand natural disasters. Since its first graduating class in 1978, the BIT program has really made a positive impact. It changes lives and makes for a better and safer built environment which we all enjoy!"

"Prior to taking the BIT program, my background was in roofing. I'm a journeyman roofer by trade, but when I was injured on the job, I was no longer able to function in my career as I knew it. I spent a significant amount of time looking for what I could do with the trade knowledge I have and trying to find something that I felt passionate about again. After a great deal of time looking, I stumbled into the Chemeketa BIT program, and soon discovered that it was a perfect fit. This program has re-ignited my passion for the trades and trade work, it has provided me with great contacts, and a positive support system. I currently have the experience of being a member of the Chemeketa International Code Council board. This program has opened many doors for me, and once I have completed the program, my goal is to work in the industry doing plan review and inspections. My 2nd goal is to figure out a way to give back and help facilitate the continued growth of this program and the continued success of future students."

The George Buttles Memorial Scholarship was established in memory of George, fondly considered the "Founding Father" of Chemeketa's Human Services Program.
