ROLE OF THE CHEMEKETA COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD OF EDUCATION

In working toward the goal of providing quality education, the Chemeketa Community College Board of Education, as duly elected representatives of the people, shall, pursuant to the statutes of Oregon and consistent with the rules of the Oregon Board of Education, have complete charge and control of all activities and programs of the district including its property, personnel, and finance.¹ It is the legal responsibility of the College Board of Education to prepare and adopt an annual budget in compliance with the Oregon budget law; to approve the expenditure of funds; to establish, maintain, and control the conduct and operation of the college property, both for school purposes and for outside activities; to establish curricula; to adopt rules and regulations for the governance of the district; and, in general, to govern the operation of Chemeketa Community College.

As a general method of operation, the College Board of Education shall retain full legislative authority over the college in accordance with the statutes of the State of Oregon, and consistent with any applicable rules of the Higher Education Coordinating Commission. The College Board of Education shall delegate executive, supervisory, and instructional functions through the college president/chief executive officer and to its employees as specified by board enactment.

Board policy is adopted to clarify the official college position on a variety of issues and to assist in providing guidelines for the efficient and harmonious operation of the college. All employees should be familiar with the board policies and college procedures for their own protection and the welfare of the college.
