Complete and signed applications and supporting documents may be submitted in-person (mail slot or 9 am – 4:30 pm, Monday-Friday); mailed; or emailed.

- Applicants must submit **proof** they meet all minimum qualifications (18 years or older, high school diploma or GED and qualifying math score, see first page) with the application.
- Applications are reviewed, scored and ranked based on applicant-supplied information.
- Apprentices are selected from the ranked Pool of Eligibles (POE) based on points.
- Information for points may be added to the application until the closing date.
- Applicants receive a letter with the results of their application after the closing date.
- Mandatory orientation is at 5 pm on September 16 in the Building 33 Apprenticeship Office on the Salem Chemeketa campus.
- Applications are not returned.
- ***Applications must be received by September 6, 2019 at 5 pm. Include copies of photo id, GED/diploma, and proof of math.***
