Transfer Overview: Candidates will be eligible to apply for admission to the College of Education and enter the Bachelor of Education in Teaching and English Language Learning *after completing 88 credits from the transfer coursework* listed below **OR** by completing an AAOT + Education and World Language requirements. Candidates may be eligible to enroll at Pacific while completing the requirements below. Substitutions/exceptions to courses in the below program may be approved prior to admission to the B.Ed. program. **All potential candidates are strongly encouraged to contact a Pacific B.Ed. & a CCC advisor to develop a planned course pathway for either their AAOT or direct transfer to ensure optimum readiness for teacher preparation.**

World Languages (Foreign Language) Demonstrated proficiency in a foreign language is required: A) Passing any 103-level language course; B) passing a Pacific or community college challenge exam in a foreign language reflecting 103-level competency; C) If first language speaker of a language other than English, language proficiency may be waived – see B.Ed. Advisor. Recommended: Spanish language speakers are encouraged to take Spanish for Native Language Speakers sequence (SPN213; 214; 215).	0-12
