**\*Students will choose major that coincides with grade level they want to teach. The options are:**

**Early Childhood Only** (PK-4th grade) Follow this guide. Do NOT take: ART115/131;PSY218;ED200, 229, 230, 265

**Early Childhood/Elementary** (PK-8<sup>th</sup> Grade Elementary School Only) Follow this guide. Do NOT take MTH111 or GS105/BI102 listed for Elementary/Middle Only

**Elementary/Middle** (3<sup>rd</sup> – 9<sup>th</sup> Grade in an Elementary or Middle School) Follow this guide, be sure to take MTH111 and either BI102 or GS105

**Middle/High:** (Middle or High School) Do NOT follow this guide. Meet with an education advisor to create an individualized plan to complete a major in the subject you will teach as well as education courses.

**Students will be advised to:**

- Pass the Civil Rights test before leaving Chemeketa Community College ([www.orela.nesinc.com](http://www.orela.nesinc.com)).
- Apply to WOU, if you are apply for financial aid, apply for admission and aid by January the year you transfer.

- The following are important requirements transfer students should be working on early:
  - Complete a minimum of 30 hours working with youth before leaving Chemeketa. Obtain a letter of documentation (on letterhead) of that experience.
  - Complete a second 30-hour experience. Must be completed no earlier than 18 months before starting the education program at WOU. The education program is typically completed the second year after transferring to Western. The first year, students are completing their teaching major/authorization.
  - Pass the Civil Rights Exam.
  - Maintain a CGPA of 2.75 with no more than one outstanding incomplete course. Earn a B- or higher in all Education classes.

**To be considered for all types of financial aid at WOU, file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) no later than March 1 every year. The FAFSA is available online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). Additional financial aid information is available at any financial aid office. Admission applications for WOU are available online at [www.wou.edu](http://www.wou.edu). Students are encouraged to apply for admission during fall term, and send a second Chemeketa grade transcript after their final term grades are posted. Early applications are encouraged. Students applying for financial aid should apply for admission in January.**
