Elementary/Middle Follow this guide, can take MTH111 and either BI102 or GS105, do not take ART115/131. Please connect with WOU advisor concerning content areas.

Middle/High: Do NOT follow this guide. Meet with an education advisor to create an individualized plan, dual enrollment may be necessary.

Students will be advised to:

- Pass the Civil Rights test before leaving Chemeketa Community College (www.orela.nesinc.com).
- If you are applying for financial aid, apply for admission and aid in fall the year before you transfer.
- Complete your AAOT degree either before or soon after transferring to WOU
- Complete 30 hours of experience with youth (a second 30 hour experience will be required but should be started no earlier than 18 months before starting the education program at WOU).
- Maintain a 2.75 GPA with no more than one outstanding incomplete course and a B- or higher in all ED classes.

Admission applications for WOU are available online at www.wou.edu. Students are encouraged to apply for admission during fall term, and send a second Chemeketa grade transcript after their final term grades are posted. Early applications are encouraged.
