

**2 Part -Basic Nursing Assistant
Program for
Non-Native English Speakers
Application Packet
Winter/Spring 2018-19**

Program Overview:

This is a two part 199 hour training course offering training approved by the Oregon State Board of Nursing (OSBN) which consists of

- 33 hour RD090 for Healthcare pre-requisite (must pass with C to continue)
- CPR Certification course (Must pass to continue)
- 80 hours on-campus classroom and lab
- 75 hours of clinical in a long term care facility.
- 11 hours of academic and language support designed to support the success of individuals for whom English is their 2nd language

Successful completion qualifies individuals to take the Nurse Assistant Competency Evaluation test for state certification as a Nursing Assistant.

Course subjects include: Interpersonal skills and communication, growth and development throughout the life cycle, cultural aspects, legal/ethical aspects, medical and nursing terminology, general patient care; patient bathing, taking and recording vital signs, feeding patients, infection control, caring for patient's personal needs.

Part 1: Students Complete the Pre-Requisites

- Students complete the Reading (RD090) for Healthcare
 - **Mandatory registration/Orientation Day : Monday January 14, 4 PM – 5:30 PM**
 - **Class will meet Monday, Tuesday and Thursday 4PM – 5:30 PM**
 - **1st Day of Class is January 28, 2019 class until March 16, 2019**
- Pass American Heart Association, "Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers". Offered as part of the program. See <http://www.americanheart.org> Date TBD
- Pass Criminal Background Check and Drug Screen
- Provide copies of required immunizations (list on page 5-7) as part of your Part 2 application

Part 2: Students complete the Core Basic Nursing Assistant (BNA) Coursework

- Students who successfully complete part one of the course, will be eligible to enter the formal BNA training.
- Application for Part 2 of the program will be completed during part 1 of the course
- **Class Times:**
 - Mandatory CNA Orientation: April 1, 2019 from 3PM – 4PM
 - Class Times (1st 5 weeks) Held Monday, Tuesday and Thursday 4 PM – 9:30 PM
 - Support Class Wednesday 4pm -5:50PM
 - Clinical Times (2nd 5 weeks) Monday, Tuesday and Thursday 6:00 am to 12:30 pm
 - **Attendance** at every class, clinical session and mock skills is a MANDATORY requirement to pass the course

Cost of Class: Part 1: \$75 Winter Part 2: \$75 Spring Total = \$150	Includes: Textbook, two sets of scrubs, stethoscope, gait belt (if applicable) provided in class), OSBN test for Certification in Spring term, Fingerprinting for OSBN, Criminal Background Check and Drug Screen, CPR Training. *Costs were reduced thanks to a partnership with Willamette Workforce Partnership*

Students are required to undergo *random* drug testing. Once accepted into the program, you will receive an email from **ESCREEN** with date-sensitive instructions on how to complete the drug screening. It is important that you check your MyChemeketa email **daily**. You will have **three days to complete the drug screening from date of issue**. Failure to complete the random drug screen in the required amount of time or if test results are positive, will result in elimination from the program. Escreen is able to provide lab locations throughout the United States.

Health Sciences TB Screening, Immunizations & CPR Requirements & Cover Sheet



Copies of all required documentation must be submitted with attached cover sheet included as one complete packet. Incomplete immunization packets will not be accepted.

The Oregon Health Authority has established standards for requirements for health professional student placements in clinical training settings within the State of Oregon. Immunizations include Hepatitis B, Measles, Mumps and rubella (MMR); Tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis (Tdap), and Varicella. Required screenings include tuberculosis. The Chemeketa Nursing Program is also requiring the influenza vaccine. All reports of TB screening and immunization status must be on official records, signed by a qualified healthcare professional, and must be complete before you are eligible to register for Health Sciences courses. We accept copies of childhood immunizations. Healthcare CPR certification is also required.

MANDATORY IMMUNIZATION/CPR REQUIREMENTS: **COPIES ONLY – NO ORIGINALS**

1. **TB Screening** - TB test is a 2-step Mantoux PPD Tuberculin skin test and must be given and read **or** receive the quantiferon gold test.
 - If you have NOT had a TB test done before, follow the steps below:
 - **Step 1** – first TB test administered, results read in 48 to 72 hours.
- ONE TO THREE WEEKS LATER -
 - **Step 2** – second TB test administered, results read in 48 to 72 hours.
 - **Step 3** - If you need the Varicella and/or MMR immunization(s), please have them done **with or after the second** TB skin test.
 - If you have had a TB test done within the last 12 months, follow the steps below:
 - **Step 1** –Please bring a previously documented negative TB test result.
 - **Step 2** – Will need second TB test administered, results read in 48 to 72 hours.
 - **Step 3** - If you need the Varicella and/or MMR immunization(s), please have them done **with or after the second** TB skin test.
 - If you have had a previously documented positive TB test result or have a history of known positive reactions, please submit a recent medical evaluation to certify you do not have active infectious tuberculosis.
2. **Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) vaccine**
 - Administer with or **after second TB skin test is complete**
 - Proof of two doses of MMR; second dose of MMR **cannot** be given sooner than 28 days after first dose *or*
 - Proof of positive titer
 - Can be given at the same time as Varicella
3. **Varicella (Chicken Pox) vaccine - (having the disease does not count as proof)**
 - Administer with or **after second TB skin test is complete**
 - Proof of two doses of varicella; second dose of varicella **cannot** be given sooner than 28 days after first dose *or*

- Proof of one dose received prior to age 13 *or*
- Proof of positive titer
- May be given at the same time as MMR

4. Hepatitis B (HBV) vaccine

- Series of three injections *or*
 - Proof of positive titer
- A minimum of the first injection is required before fall term registration
- The minimum timeframe between the first and second injection is one month, and between the second and third injection is five months.

5. Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis (Tdap) vaccine

- Vaccination within the last 10 years. May be given at an interval shorter than 10 years.

6. Flu vaccine

- Fall and Winter admit students

Exemptions to the requirements for immunizations may be claimed by students for medical or non-medical reasons. Documentation for exemption requires one or more of the following:

a. Medical –

A written statement of exemption signed by a licensed independent practitioner; or

b. Non-Medical –

A signed Vaccine Education Certificate you receive after talking with your healthcare provider *or* watch the College Measles Module online and print out and sign the Vaccine Education Certificate at the end of the module. You can find more information at:

IMPORTANT: Students who exempt themselves from the vaccination requirements should be aware that circumstances may arise that would require their exclusion from clinical and/or classroom settings. Also, illness that may result from lack of immunizations may prevent students from attending class or clinical sessions. Either exclusion from clinical and/or class or missed time due to illness may result in an inability to meet course requirements and, therefore, the need to withdraw from Health Sciences program.

Disability Accommodations (if requested): **Medical evaluations of physical capacity** may be necessary to provide information needed to accommodate functional limitations. When needed for this purpose, reports of an examination conducted by a licensed healthcare professional may be required from students. Students requesting accommodations should make an appointment with the College’s Office for Services for Students with Disabilities at 503-399-5276.
