Two Quantitative and Analytical Reasoning Credits To satisfy the Quantitative and Analytical Reasoning requirement, students will be required to receive two credits. At least one of these credits must be designated by a star (*). Courses with the star (*) designation are designed to expand students' quantitative boundaries and provide them with the skills necessary to interpret and apply mathematics. Willamette University evaluates each course taken as part of the Oregon Transfer Associate of Arts degree on an individual basis. Students completing the AAOT will receive the full 90 credits equivalency at Willamette. ***Contacting Willamette at the beginning of your second year at CCC will contribute to a smooth transfer process.**

NOTES:

1. A minimum of two of these three credits must be taken at Willamette. One requirement may be satisfied by completing 8 credits from WR 121, WR 122, and WR227 with a grade of C- or above. If transferring in with Junior Standing, students may petition for additional writing courses taken at CCC to satisfy a second of the three required credits.
2. Requirements for foreign language may be satisfied by: 1) demonstrated proficiency through testing, or 2) completion of second-year level (college). Completing foreign language requirements at high school level also requires demonstrated proficiency through testing at Willamette.
3. Students who attend CCC 1-2 terms may satisfy only one Mode of Inquiry (MOI) area. Students who attend CCC 3 terms may satisfy two MOI areas. Students who attend CCC 4 terms or more may satisfy 3 MOI areas.

Other MOI courses will need to be satisfied through coursework at Willamette.
4. One Willamette credit is equal to four semester hours or six-quarter hours. Thirty-one Willamette credits are required to graduate from Willamette. Willamette accepts a maximum of 96 quarter credits in transfer.
5. For fall term admission, new freshmen and transfer students with fewer than 90 credits should apply by February 1.
6. No developmental or professional/technical courses are accepted at Willamette.
7. To be accepted in transfer, coursework must be completed with at least a C minus (C-) grade and must either be similar to courses offered at Willamette or taught in a department similar to one at Willamette.
8. All PE and professional/technical coursework is excluded when computing the grade point average of transfer applicants.
9. Willamette does not accept college courses taken in high school. However, these credits may be accepted if: 1) courses are taken at a college, and not applied to the high school diploma; 2) courses are applied as part of the Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer (AAOT) degree and the degree is completed before transferring.
10. Advanced Placement (AP) credits are accepted up to sophomore level. CLEP (College Level Exam Prep) credits, prior learning and/or cooperative work experience credits, and correspondence credits are not accepted. AP credits do not satisfy Modes of Inquiry Courses.
11. If interested in Bachelor of Music degree, contact Willamette's music department.

Students applying for financial aid for Fall Semester are encouraged to mail their financial aid application by February 1 to receive priority consideration. Willamette requires the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). Applications are available in Chemeketa's Counseling and Career Services or Financial Aid Office.
