

## Transfer Guide for: Pacific University-Woodburn Bachelor of Education in Teaching & English Language Learning Elementary Multiple Subjects Endorsement

**Transfer Overview:** The Bachelor of Education in Teaching and English Language Learning program prepares teacher candidates through community and clinical based practice to be successful teachers, leaders, and advocates. 100 quarter credits/67 semester credits of transfer coursework are required for the degree. Prior to formal enrollment into the B.Ed. program, students must have completed an AAOT degree OR at least 75% of the coursework listed below. Students may co-enroll in remaining transfer courses after admission to the B.Ed. program. Applicant transcripts are evaluated on a case-by-case basis, and an academic plan is created for each applicant. Substitutions to the transfer plans outlined below may be made by the B.Ed. coordinator to accommodate variances in community college courses and individual student backgrounds.

<b>RECOMMENDED ELECTIVES</b> The Pacific B.Ed. degree program includes 100 transfer credits. To fulfill these credits and support earning an Oregon teaching license, students are strongly encouraged to include 4 humanities, 3 science, 4 mathematics, and 2 social science courses. Other electives include ART, HPE 295 (or other PE courses equalling 3 credits), any education course, and additional courses of specific interest to you. Service courses & Spanish Learning in Oaxaca, Mexico also provide rich experiences for future teachers.		needed to total 100
<b>LANGUAGE RECOMMENDATION</b> B.Ed. students are placed in multilingual school settings. It is highly recommended that all English-only speakers transferring to the B.Ed. program complete at least one year of language study representative of our surrounding community (Spanish or Russian). Bilingual students are highly encouraged to earn the Oregon Seal of Biliteracy, which may include Spanish for Native Speakers courses.
